

We are at the start of a New Year and many make new goals. Cultivating or improving skills in leadership is one such possibility. What are the qualities to which we should aspire to be a good leader? How do we guide the group we are involved with in order to reach goals, to strive toward a vision for the future? Growing up in 4-H and FFA, I had many opportunities to study and then practice leadership skills at both the local and district levels that fostered active participation throughout life. As an adult, I have served in leadership roles in diverse groups ranging from college, church elder, college ministry board, parenting and homeschooling groups, community activism and local/district Optimist organizations. All these experiences molded and shaped me as I assimilated valuable attributes of leadership. While many qualities assist in leading a group, here are five basic elements of leadership that I believe should be cultivated.

A leader of substance will have a vision and goals to impart to their community. It is important that a leader provides direction, sets priorities, and motivates others to reach a common goal. A strong leader inspires others to see their vision, guides, leads by example, and does so with integrity and sincerity. A group, be it an Optimist Club, a church elder board, a family, or a corporation needs a leader that 'keeps the flock together' by providing a roadmap and a destination.

A good leader will have strong communication skills, be proactive in problem solving, and will be looking ahead, being aware of how things are working within the community they serve. By having skill in communication, a leader is better able to impart their ideas, their vision, their direction, and will be better able to motivate others. Poor commu-

nication skills foster confusion.

A strong leader is a servant to those they lead. By being willing to work hard, putting other's interests above their own, even doing the less pleasant tasks, a servant-minded leader draws others to himself and in doing so, inspires a passion for serving.

A good leader endeavors to build relationships. By practicing kindness, giving encouragement, lending a helping hand, offering sincere gratitude, and listening to concerns, a leader encourages walls to come down and the group to become more cohesive.

By keeping a positive outlook, a good leader sets an example for others and encourages optimism within the community. A positive attitude coupled with a healthy sense of humor helps us handle the frustrations of life both as an individual and a community. Setting an example of positivity in all circum-

stances allows others to feel secure and keep an upbeat mindset, which in turn fuels a passion for reaching the goal.

The qualities of a good leader are of great importance to the success of an organization, regardless of size. Inspiring a vision, communicating well, being a servant to others, building relationships within the community while maintaining a positive outlook

all serve to make the organization stronger. Jesus calls me to love, to serve, to care about the people around me. His example of leadership guides me in my daily life and in the way I relate to those around me.


