Hello fellow Optimist,

I am resending this message as there was a mistake in the details with regard to the 4th Quarter incentive. Please see revised content below and I apologize for the confusion.

As we enter the ninth month of our Optimist year, First Lady Penny and I want to thank all the Clubs and Districts that have made us feel welcome during our visits. It is so gratifying to meet the wonderful people working to make our communities a better place, for ourselves and our children.

Knowing how hard our Members work makes it all the more tragic that there are fewer of us every year. As our numbers dwindle, so does our impact. Because, while our Clubs are shrinking, the needs of our communities certainly aren't.

We *must* grow as well.

We hope our fourth quarter membership incentive will get us back on the right track. From July 1 to Sept. 30, we are offering cash prizes to the Clubs that recruit the most new Members, both in absolute terms and as a percentage of current membership.

Correction of June "Just 3 Things". The top three clubs in each category in all of Optimist International (NOT IN EACH DISTRICT – as stated in my June message) will get the monetary awards.

Here's a breakdown of the rewards (REVISED):

- \$1,000 to one Club in all of Optimist International that adds the most new members (category 1).
- \$1,000 to one Club in all of Optimist International that adds the highest percentage of new members (category 2).
- \$750 to each of the second-place Clubs in both categories.
- \$500 to each of the third-place Clubs in both categories.
- \$300 to two Clubs drawn randomly from participating Clubs not in the top three in either category.

If you want to join the incentive program and compete for the cash prizes, just follow these two simple steps:

Register your Club to participate by July 15. You can do so by filling out this [registration form](#). Please note that this program is only open to regular Optimist clubs. Junior Optimist Clubs, college Clubs, and any Clubs built under a pilot project are **not** eligible.

Recruit as many new members as you can between July 1 and September 30. New members' dues must be paid by October 31, and they must still be on the Club roster in January 2024. The winning Clubs will be announced as soon as possible after Nov. 6.

INDIANA NORTH DISTRICT DISTINGUISHED OPTIMIST AWARD

This award was established to recognize the Optimist of the club who has made the greatest contribution to the cause of Optimism in his/her own club and to the Indiana North District during the year of competition.

AWARD NAME: This award shall be designated as

AWARD: A specially designed plaque will be presented to the selected Optimist at the October District Board meeting following his/her selections. The recipient shall be announced at the District Convention and shall have a place of honor at all District functions during the year of the award.

PURPOSE: The purpose of the award is to stimulate club interest in District activities by directing recognition to an individual for his/her outstanding contributions to the objectives of Optimism. The award is for unselfish devotion and enthusiastic activity in promoting the growth and success of his/her Optimist club and the Indiana North District.

QUALIFICATIONS: Nominees must have been a member of an Optimist club in good standing for at least one year. They have a record of perfect attendance and have sponsored at least one new member during the period of competition. Although emphasis will be placed on current activities, a nominee's background of past activities, honors and accomplishments will be taken into consideration in making the selection. The dossier of all nominees shall include their past club histories and District activities in respect to offices held, year elected to club membership, attendance and honors and distinctions in other service fields. Nominees must not currently be a member of the Executive Committee.

PERIOD: The period of competition shall cover ten (10) months, October 1 through July 31.

NOMINATIONS: Nominations for the award shall originate with Optimist clubs in Nominations may also be submitted by District Officers. Only one nominee will be permitted from a club, and all nominations be submitted on the prescribed form which is included in the District Roster Book.

SUBMISSION: Nomination on the prescribed form must be submitted to the District Secretary-Treasurer on or before August 1 of the competition year.

SELECTION: The selection committee shall consider all nominations received and shall recommend not more than six (6) nominees to the Executive Committee for further consideration. The selection committee shall compile a complete dossier of nominees which shall be submitted to the Executive Committee. The name of the nominees not receiving the award shall not be made public.

This award was established to recognize the Optimist who has made the greatest contribution to the community, humanity, and Optimism in the Indiana North District during the year of completion.

AWARD NAME: This award shall be designated as the “INDIANA NORTH DISTRICT HUMANITARIAN AWARD”

AWARD: A specially designed plaque will be presented to the selected Optimist at the October Board meeting following his/her selection. The recipient will be announced at the District Convention and will have a place of honor at all District functions during the year of the award.

PURPOSE: The purpose of the award is to stimulate club interest in District activities by directing recognition to an individual for his/her outstanding contributions to humanity and Optimism. The award will be made for unselfish devotion and enthusiastic activity in promoting and / or participating in humanitarian activities within his/her community and the Indiana North District.

QUALIFICATIONS: Nominees must have been a member of an Optimist Club in good standing for at least one year. Although emphasis will be placed on current activities, a nominee’s background of past activities, honors and accomplishments will be taken into consideration in making the selection. These activities and honors shall primarily be other than club-related activities. **HOWEVER**, his/her community service and humanitarian activities be independent of the nominee’s affiliation. The dossier of all nominees shall include the year of their election to

Optimist club membership and honors and distinctions in community and humanitarian activities. No member of the Executive Committee shall be eligible for nomination and /or selection during the year.

PERIOD: The period of competition will cover ten (10) months, from October 1 through the following July 31.

NOMINATIONS: Nominations for the award shall originate from Optimist Clubs in good standing or may be submitted by District officers. Nominations from clubs must be approved by the Club’s Board of directors. Only one nomination from each club will be permitted and all nominations be submitted on the prescribed form which is included in the District Roster Book.

SUBMISSIONS: Nominations on the prescribed form must be submitted to the District Secretary-Treasurer prior to August 1 of the competition year.

SELECTION: The selection committee will consider all nominations received and will recommend not more than six (6) nominees to the Executive Committee for further consideration and selection. The selection committee shall compile complete dossiers which shall be submitted to the Executive Committee. The names of nominees not receiving the award shall not be made public.


