Susan Delay, of the New Castle Optimist Club is club advisor to the New Castle High School JOI club.

Lilly F and Ishmine H chatted about their JOI club status. This club has 30 members that started as a community service of kids helping others. Projects include trash pickup, tree planting, & babysitting while parents Christmas shop. The group fundraised by selling lemonade and desserts at the school cookout and sold Christmas grams.

Gov Chris thanked all who are involved with the Junior clubs for the opportunity to talk about their clubs.

Fun Break hosted by Julie R and Sandy R coordinated a Hawaiian Scavenger Hunt.

At 11:18a, Gov Chris called the Business Session to order.

Q1 Meeting Minutes: Shelley M emailed the minutes prior to the meeting for all to review. Ann H made a motion to accept the meeting minutes with a second from Sandy R, all approved, motion passed.

Financial Report: Jim S prepared the financials which were emailed prior for review. PG Gregg gave the overview with Jim out at a club event. All is in good order, will file these reports for audit.

Old Business

Special Needs Club: OI has ended this pilot program. Various sponsor clubs are assisting the SN clubs with membership options such as joining sponsor clubs or dissolving or club within a club.

Convention Bids: Sandy R proposed August 22 & 23, 2025 at the Courtyard by Marriott in downtown Muncie hosted by the Muncie club at \$134/night. No other options came forward.

New Business N/A. With no other new business, at 11:54a Gov Chris moved to adjourn the Business Session with a motion from Pam G and a second from Ann H, all approved, motion passed.

Chair Reports

A&A: Sandy R noted 8 clubs of 34 reported in the district. Updated forms were sent out. During the 1st Quarter, 648 members worked 1,068 hours serving 8,313 youth spending \$46,467.01 and income of \$43,258.54. Winning clubs in Zone 2: no reports Zone 3: Rochester Zone 4: Decatur Zone 5: West Jay Zone 6: Hammond Zone 7: Chesterfield and Zone 9: New Castle Breakfast Sandy will send updates with changes, mail out buttons and will resend the A&A forms.

Childhood Cancer: Ann H shared this year's theme is "space". Always accepting donations to make 80-100 goody bags for the campers in June. Will have a list of needs by the Q3 meeting.

District Foundation Rep: Nancy B had technology issues unable to report. Hopeful to be at the Q3 meeting to talk about OI Foundation. Jim B commented how easy it is to do Dime A Day or 365 to raise money for the foundation.

Essay: Susan D noted the submission deadline is February 28th

- ◇ All submissions in google or word format will be run through AI which is a new requirement this year.

Oratorical: Jim B said the finals will be on 4/20 at the Q3 meeting in Kokomo. A hard copy of the speech submission will be run through AI which is a new requirement this year, too. Regional sites are not set up yet (north, south and central sites needed).

Respect for Law: Pam G recently emailed ideas and suggestions for projects to recognize law officials or activities. If your club does a project, please share with Pam so we can share it with the district.

International Convention:

Gary A commented the event will be in Canada (Niagara Falls) this year and hotel rooms are filling up. Be sure you have your passport in order. Registration is going live this week.

Misc: Gov Chris reviewed various upcoming webinars and training available from OI. Remember to do your club officer trainings and electives by 3/31 through the Optimist Institute. Chris also noted upcoming activities like International Day of Happiness is March 18th


CCDHH and Tri Star finals along with the IN South will be announced soon.
