Lafayette Breakfast Club gave out Teachers Grants. Here are some of the results from those grants.

Sharing Teacher Grants-Round 1: When Dave and Janie Norman arrived outside the Downtowner Wednesday, they observed a lady unloading a number of plastic buckets and assorted other items from her car into a child's wagon. When it became obvious that she was bringing the wagon into the restaurant, they assisted with the doors and helped her navigate her "wagon train" to the meeting room, where she joined fellow grant winners ready to share their grant results. Beth Hassenplug had come well-prepared with visual aids for her interactive presentation. And the club members loved the involvement as they drummed on the buckets, attempting to follow, some more successfully than others, Beth's musical instruction as she explained how the buckets and drumsticks she purchased with her grant enabled her to teach basic music skills and work on brain-hand coordination with her fifth graders. Abigail Rascoe's grant purchased Gelli Plate printing materials for her K-5 art classes. The examples she showed of the final products and the methods used to achieve them in just 30 minutes a week with each class were amazing.

Laura Dearing and Samantha Snowberger used their grant to tackle the math skills deficiencies in their 6-8 grade students due to Covid delays and other factors. They purchased and worked with a program called Reflex, in which assessment, coaching, and practice are delivered via a fun, game-based approach. And because it is fully adaptive, students get the individualized instruction they need to be successful. Their students improved their proficiency from 38% to over 70%.

Jeff High School Math Teacher Wendy Towle's project, entitled "Navigating Warehouse Management in the World of Math" allowed her students to apply mathematical concepts in a real-world scenario through simulation.

One common thread throughout all these presentations is that all of them can be used over and over, extending the number of students impacted.

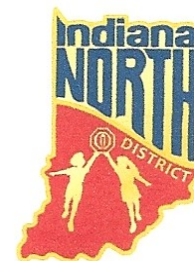
