From Lafayette Breakfast Optimist Club

TEACHER GRANTS 6: Week six of Teacher Grant presentations brought us three teachers whose passion and excitement about their grant project outcomes were evident in their voices as they spoke.

Although the cash amounts awarded to them were smaller than many of the others, they affected a large number of students.

Jill Stanis, a fourth-grade teacher from Mintonye, and Tiffany Brann, who works with K-5 students at Mayflower Mills, received grants for projects that focused on improving reading ability. Jill's grant introduced her students to novel reading while Tiffany's grant purchased books of various levels for English learners, many of whom were just beginning to learn to read and spoke no English. Both spoke of the excitement of their students as they received the books. Rachel McGlothlin, an art teacher at Miami and Edgelea Elementaries and a repeat grant winner used her grant funds to purchase Model Magic Clay for her K-4 art class projects. She showed some amazing photos of the creative results, from clay lollipops made by her first graders to the detailed roses created by her fourth graders for Mother's Day gifts. Teacher Grant presentations will culminate this week (July 16) with four more teachers scheduled to speak. A special guest will attend this week's presentation: Tippecanoe Board Member Connie Harper will join us for the last of the presenta-



2026 Visual Arts Contest Competition

Guidelines

The contest will be held at the Club or school level and International level. The topic this year is Be Bold - Be The Change.

2. Club or school level judging may be by Club Members, teachers, professional artists/instructors, or by public voting. Clubs and schools should submit their best entries for judging at the international level.
3. The project for the Visual Arts Competition shall be the creation of a set of twelve note cards and envelopes.
4. Artist must be age eleven or lower as of October 1, 2025. There are two age divisions: up to 7 years of age and 8-11 years of age. Art for notecards will be selected from each age division, proportionate to number of entries. Limit one entry per artist.
5. Clubs or schools may provide awards to participants and winners at the local level.
6. Artwork must be created on 11" wide x 8.5" high paper or construction paper. The artist's name should be written lightly on the back of the artwork.
7. Actual, physical artwork of the Club winner(s) must be submitted to OI no later than March 1, 2026. Do not fold the art work, and be sure to protect the artwork by placing it between two pieces of thin cardboard before placing it inside of a large envelope. Mark the outside of the envelope with the words, "DO NOT BEND". Send to Optimist International, c/o Marketing, 4494 Lindell Blvd, St. Louis, MO 63108
8. At the International level, 12 winners will receive a \$150 monetary award; the winner of the cover will receive an additional \$100 monetary award.
9. The notecards will be available for sale as early as June 28, 2026, at the international convention in Jacksonville, Florida, and online.


